Quick Tip:

Consider making the research task competitive by dividing chapter members into small groups and rewarding the group that can identify the most findings in 30 minutes with a prize (eg. 1UP sticker)!

Youth-friendly cities are urban areas designed with policies and infrastructure that prioritize young people's needs, safety, and wellbeing. These cities ensure accessible, inclusive, and engaging environments that promote children and adolescents' active participation, health, and development.

Your chapter's challenge is to explore youth-friendly policies and guidelines and assess their implementation in your community. Identify any gaps where these policies are lacking and propose innovative new policies that could enhance the well-being and engagement of young people in your area.

02 LOCAL RESEARCH

30 mins

Now that you have reviewed global policies for promoting youth-friendly communities, it's time to examine those implemented in your city. Look into your municipality's master plan or specific guidelines regarding youth-friendly community-making. Identify the policies that stand out, those actively fostered in your community, and those that have yet to be introduced.

Tips for reviewing municipal plans and guidelines:

- Start with the executive summary or introduction to get an overview of the main goals and priorities being addressed.
- Given that municipal plans, guidelines, and documents in general can be lengthy, use the table of contents and index to locate specific topics related to youth-friendly initiatives.
- It is helpful to search for keywords and phrases such as
 - youth
 - age-friendly
 - education
 - o recreation
 - o inclusive communities
- Some ideas you may want to focus your attention on are plans for parks, playgrounds, sports facilities, cultural centres, mental health support, libraries, and accessible facilities for all youth including those with disabilities

If your municipality does not have youth policies, look into other active organizations in your community such as the <u>YMCA</u> and <u>YWCA</u>, and summarize their program initiatives.

Please summarize the policies found and created along with an explanation as to their significance in a slideshow of up to ten (10) slides. Feel free to format it however you want (policies can be in point form). The main focus is on the quality of the content and the creativeness of your new policies.
